Through hands-on activities and close examination of your own photograph collection, you'll learn how to identify different photographic techniques and understand their unique vulnerabilities. Whether you're a history buff, archivist, or just love old photos, this workshop will help you see photographs in a whole new way.

# Robin Canham, Conservator

Robin holds a Bachelor of Arts (English) from the University of Regina, and a Master of Information Studies, specializing in Library Studies, from the University of Toronto. She worked as an Academic Librarian for several years, before returning to post-secondary studies at Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario where she completed a Master of Art Conservation, specializing in paper, photographs, and new media.

She has worked in the conservation labs of the Queen's University Archives, the Provincial Archives of Alberta, and the Royal Saskatchewan Museum. In 2022–23, she was the Kress Conservation Fellow at the Queen's University Library's W.D. Jordan Rare Books and Special Collections, where she focused on book conservation.

This spring, Robin launched Canham Conservation in Regina, SK, a private conservation practice dedicated to the care and preservation of books, paper, and photographs.
